



It's half-way through the season so we thought we'd catch up with First team coach Jesse Bridgeman.

WCSC: Hi Jesse, so how long have you been involved with Wanneroo? **JB:** This will be my 7th year at Wanneroo City. I first came to the club as a player in 2016 which was an injury hit season and the same for 2017 before I got into coaching in 2018 with the State League Reserves.



WCSC: With covid now being present in WA, how difficult has it been to combat these issues each week? **JB:** The past 2 seasons have been extremely difficult with covid. This season, the first 5 rounds proved hard with players missing, but never enough to postpone games, so we had to keep pushing on as best we could.

WCSC: As a coach, what is most important to you? **JB:** The most important thing is watching players develop from youth to Men's State League and being part of the team, working towards the same goals – very rewarding when we get 3 points on match-days.

WCSC: What do you like about Wanneroo City Soccer Club?

JB: The main draw towards this club is the culture and people behind the scenes – the work ethic to help the club grow, and players get supported through their

development...everyone is involved in this process. This is something that is very special here. I will continue to work hard to help push this in the right direction.

WCSC: It's been a difficult first half of the season – how do you see us getting to where we want to be?

JB: This season has been very difficult due to many reasons and has resulted in a current position on the ladder that we are not familiar with. But this is one we are looking forward to turning around in the second half of the season. As a coaching group, we feel as long as there is a fit squad (no covid/injuries etc.) on the park week-in, week-out, then things will be turned around. The players remain positive, and so do the coaching group. We are looking forward to the challenge ahead of us.

Thank you Jesse – your passion and loyalty is plain to see. Everyone at the club is behind you. We wish all the best for you and the team this season.
